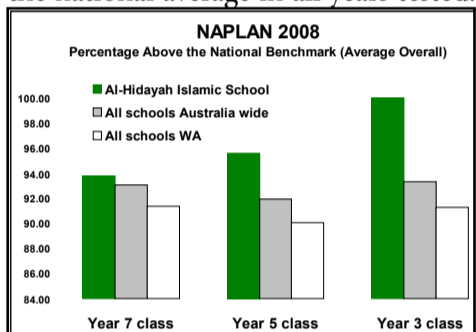

## AL-HIDAYAH ACADEMIC SCORES ABOVE NATIONAL AVERAGE

COMPARISONS over the past eight years (2000-2007) as well as the results from this year's National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) show that Al-Hidayah Islamic School continues to achieve better scores overall compared to all schools, not just in WA, but across Australia. In the graph you can see that the average percentage of students at or above the national benchmark for all schools in WA is below the national average while the Al-Hidayah Islamic School is above the national average in all years tested.

STUDENTS of Al-Hidayah Islamic School, with the cooperation of their parents, teachers, and peers are required to conduct themselves according to the principles of Islam and the Sunnah of the Holy Prophet Muhammad (SAW); and according to school rules and guidelines. Allah will have His Mercy on them. Surely Allah is All-Mighty, All-Wise. [Qur'an; 9:71]
